To earn the B.Sc. IBA degree, students must complete:

1. Students are required to meet the requirements set by the Department for “English Proficiency” and “International Studies,” in addition to earning the required number of credits to be eligible for graduation
2. Freshman students can apply for an inter-departmental (micro) credit program. For more information, please visit the Curriculum Section webpage.
3. Students have the opportunity to intern either domestically or abroad, provided their applications are reviewed and approved by the school. It is important for students interning domestically or abroad to note that their enrollment is limited to 9 credits for that semester. Internships will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Additionally, internships completed abroad can be counted as “International Studies.”
